INVITATION SYSTEM FOR THE GLOBAL CHAMPIONS TOUR (GCT)

- 60% of the riders (30) will consist of the riders 1 to 30 on the Rolex Rankings two months prior to the event. In case of riders declining invitations replacements will be selected from the Rolex Rankings in descending order. Riders in this group cannot be lower on the Rolex Rankings than 150th place. Requirements obliging organising committees to invite at least two riders from each NF are to be relaxed;
- 10% of the participants (5) will be home riders and will be selected from the top 150 riders on the Rolex Rankings. Also included in this group is the FEI Wild card.
- 30% of the participants (15) are selected by the OC. It is not obligatory that these participants be chosen from the Rolex Rankings;
- The FEI will apply a certain amount of flexibility in relation to enforcing the rule obliging OCs to have at least 10 NFs represented.

Athletes are invited by the Organising Committee through their NF.

All participating horses must be in possession of:

- 1) a declaration (with a detailed list) from their own NF stating that the same is temporarily imported into Italy to take part in CSI La Mandria - Turin ;
- 2) an ATA form, especially for extra European Countries or in the case the horse will pass through not EU Countries (crossing not communitarian nations) (for further information see: <http://www.atacarnet.com/>);
- 3) official veterinary health certificates on the International Form issued from the official veterinary health authorities of the Country of origin

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

In any case, all participants with zero penalties in the first round return for the second round. The participants that tie for the 18th place (penalties and time) are allowed to participate in the second round.

Participants are classified according to their penalties in both rounds and if necessary according to their penalties and time in the jump-off.

The participants of the second round not taking part in the jump-off are classified according to their penalties in both rounds and time in the second round. The participants of the first round not taking part in the second round are classified according to their penalties and time in the first round.

The starting order will be established according to a draw. Participants are divided into two groups based on their position on the Rolex Rankings at the time of the event. The competitors in the group with the higher ranked participants start last in the first round. The order of starting in the second round is according to the reverse order of penalties and time in the first round. The order of starting in the jump-off is according to the same order as in the second round.
